Children's Privacy Notice

Steel Valley Beacon Arts (SVBA) allows parents to register their children as members. This Privacy Policy for Child Membership explains what information we collect to manage these memberships. This policy only applies to memberships set up for children under 13. You can find additional information on how SVBA collects and uses information for members aged over 13 in our Members Privacy Policy.

INFORMATION WE COLLECT

When you create a membership for your child, we will ask for information about them:

Information you provide us: we will ask for the following information about your child.

- their name
- their address
- their date of birth
- their contact number (if applicable)
- their email address (if applicable)

We will also ask for:

- your contact number
- your emergency contact details

Additional information: with your permission we also collect their image in the form of photographs and video clips.

HOW WE USE INFORMATION

We use the information we collect for the following purposes:

Communications: We use their / your information when we need to send production notifications and respond to you when they / you contact us. We also use their / your information to promote new productions or events you may be interested in.

Promote safety and security: We use their / your information in the event of an emergency or safeguarding situation.

Marketing: We use their information (images and names) to promote our productions.

SVBA Archive: We use their information to maintain an archive of our productions and group history.

For personal data subject to GDPR we rely on your parental consent as our legal basis for processing. You may withdraw your consent at any time by contacting our Data Officer.

HOW YOUR INFORMATION IS SHARED

We do not share your child's personal data except in the limited circumstances described below.

For legal reasons or to prevent harm: We may preserve or disclose information about them to comply with a law, regulation, legal process or government request; to assert legal rights or defend against legal claims, or threats to the physical safety of any person.

We may share non-personal information that is aggregated or de-identified so that it cannot reasonably be used to identify an individual. We may disclose such information publically and to third parties, for example, in public reports about our productions, or as part of funding applications.

HOW TO ACCESS AND DELETE YOUR CHILD'S PERSONAL INFORMATION

As a parent, you have control over your child's membership information.

If at any time you wish to stop the use of your child's personal information you can terminate their membership by completing a membership termination form.

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOUR CHILD TURNS 13?

When your child turns 13, he or she will be eligible to independently manage their SVBA membership. If your child chooses to manage their membership, you will no longer have access to, or be able to exercise control over their personal data.
